
COME TO OUR FOURTH QUARTER EVENT

December 7, 2021 will mark the 80th anniversary of the unprovoked attack on Pearl Harbor and the Reaganites will be commemorating the occasion with a special presentation. The four-star admiral in charge of Pearl Harbor (and in fact the commander in chief of the entire United States Pacific Fleet) was Admiral Husband Kimmel. Admiral Kimmel is the grandfather of WRHI radio Co-Owner and Managing Partner Manning Kimmel. Manning has agreed to speak to our group about a fascinating book about his grandfather, the attack and its aftermath and his families efforts to clear Admiral Kimmel's name.



The book, <u>A Matter of Honor: Pearl Harbor: Betrayal, Blame, and a Family's Quest for Justice</u> is <u>available at the York County Public Library and the Winthrop University library,</u> or <u>here</u>. The book is also available as an audiobook and would make great listening on a long ride on Thanksgiving weekend. Both Manning and I urge you to read the book before our December meeting. It tells in detail about the events leading up to and following the attack. The book details attempts by the Admiral and his sons and now his grandchildren, as well as <u>numerous</u> Navy admirals and veterans groups, to clear the Admiral's name.

This month Mark writes about Critical Race Theory in his piece FETID LILIES:

Fetid Lilies

In sonnet ninety-four, Shakespeare turns his brilliance to youth and its fickleness, ending the sonnet with one of the most memorable of his couplets: "For sweetest things turn sourcest by their deeds/Lilies that fester smell far worse than weeds."

This couplet came to mind as the current controversy regarding Critical Race Theory (CRT) swirls madly about the country. Former President Obama, the recently deposed Terry McAuliffe, and all the other quacksalvers notwithstanding, CRT is no tempest in a teapot. It isn't a balefire that lights the way to a better future but a torch that incinerates our past while scorching our present. On the one hand, nothing could be more "sweet" than the idea of equality. On the other, nothing could be more putrescible than the idea that one race is better than another, but that is exactly what CRT teaches.

If any good has come out of the Wuhan Pandemic—and it's unclear that we can think in those terms yet—it is the realization of parents of school age children that public schools seek more to indoctrinate than they do to educate. This is not only apparent from deplorable reading and math scores that are regularly reported, but also from the fierce and unapologetic "wokeism" of the National Education Association (NEA), the national teachers' union.

SHORTCOMINGS OF ROCK HILL SOUTH-SIDE TIF


There is another Tax Increment Financing ("TIF") district proposed for Rock Hill. A TIF is defined by the <u>Municipal Association of South Carolina</u> as "a public finance tool that municipalities use to help revitalize an area that has become, or is in danger of becoming, run down or blighted. A TIF allows municipalities to incur debt for the redevelopment of a project area and use the additional property tax revenue generated by the redevelopment projects to pay off that debt."

The new Rock Hill TIF is proposed for the south-side, and according to many knowledgeable people there are several shortcomings of the proposed south-side TIF in Rock Hill. For instance the boundaries of the TIF have been broadened well beyond the blighted south-side to include rural areas the city had to annex just to include in the TIF. That dilutes the benefit to the south-side.

Even worse, the City refuses to say the money the TIF generates will stay in the south-side or even the extended TIF area. They reserve the right to use the south side TIF money for any area of the city -- including the Panther's project.

The City asked the County and also the Rock Hill School District to participate – essentially turning over the County and School tax revenues to the City. The County asked for more information.

The School District has so far refused to participate in the TIF and that is a good thing because the School Tax, which is by far the largest portion of your tax bill, needs to stay in the School District to help Rock Hill Schools. As you can see on the chart below which was calculated using tools on the Education Consumers Foundation website, the Rock Hill Schools* are falling behind the other districts in York County. (*- the Rock Hill School District is legally known as "York County School District 3.)




