CANDIDATE FORUMS

York County GOP Chairman Ben Ignatowicz, himself a Reaganite, recently mentioned there could be as many as 38 races on the June 14 primary ballot – everything from Governor and U.S. Senate to South Carolina Superintendent of Education and Commissioner of the South Carolina Department of Agriculture all the way down to State House and perhaps even County Council.

For the York County primary races (e.g., SC House seats) the Reaganites plan to host candidate forums.

ENDORSING PRIMARY CANDIDATES

As we did two years ago, all Reaganites who are <u>current in their dues</u> will be able to cast an "eballot" on which local candidates the Reaganites will endorse in the Republican primary. Our endorsement will include a monetary contribution as well as "boots on the ground."

A MESSAGE FROM OUR SHERIFF

This is Kevin Tolson, President of the South Carolina Sheriffs Association and York County Sheriff, I'm writing to you personally because you need to know where law enforcement stands on an issue that's making its way around the South Carolina statehouse.

To cut right to the chase, I am strongly against the bills trying to legalize "medical" marijuana in South Carolina.

Simply put, it's a dangerous idea.

I understand supporters of this bill are seeking to bring comfort and relief to friends and family members who are suffering from debilitating illnesses. I have extreme compassion for those individuals, but I can't endorse or even ignore the attempt to provide relief through illegal methods, especially when those attempts will jeopardize public safety.

Find your state legislators here

Marijuana is an illegal substance. It's not medicine.

Despite law enforcement's best efforts, South Carolina consistently ranks among the worst states in the nation for drunk drivers. Impaired driving will only be further exacerbated if "medical" marijuana is legalized.

Methods that determine the presence of THC in the bloodstream exist, but additional processes are needed to determine an exact level of impairment.

So, if this bill passes and "medical" marijuana becomes legal, law enforcement will have no way to legally determine impairment based upon THC or be able to successfully prosecute drivers who have it in their blood.

Since marijuana remains federally illegal, marijuana-based companies largely operate in cash only. So, these businesses are far more susceptible to armed robberies. And collecting and remitting taxes based on proceeds that stem from the sale of federally illegal products becomes problematic.

I want to underscore that law enforcement's concerns regarding this legislation do not stem from a lack of compassion. Quite the opposite is true.

We have tremendous compassion for those who are desperate for medical assistance AND those who will undoubtedly be impacted by the unintended consequences of this legislation.

There's a lot of reasons why I'm against this bill. These are just the tip of the iceberg.

As your Sheriff and President of the South Carolina Sheriffs Association, I'm going to continue doing my job of keeping you, your family, and our communities safe by actively working to oppose this bill.

I urge you to do the same. I ask you to stand with me and implore the General Assembly to resist the urge to bypass the FDA regulatory process and allow legitimate scientific research to drive this debate rather than emotion or politics.

To my knowledge, this is the only instance where legislators are trying to dictate what medicine is instead of medical professionals and their approval processes at FDA


Please contact your state legislators and let them know where law enforcement stands—we're against legalizing "medical" marijuana.

ESSAY OF THE MONTH

Read what the Reaganites Second Vice President, Dr. Mark Herring, has to say about the state of the news media in America today:

Why the Fourth Estate is in receivership

The fourth estate, journalism, is racing to receivership unless we can rescue it from its rapacious self. The hubris hasn't always been this bad, this blatant, or this biased, yet it worsens daily.

In the town I grew up in, Nashville, Tennessee, there were two newspapers in the 1950s and 1960s, one for the morning, the other in the evening, and three television stations that carried the news.

I delivered both newspapers at one point in my teenage years, dragging myself out of bed before school at five in the morning (often unsuccessfully, I might add). The morning paper, owned by a well-known Democrat operative, ran a left-leaning paper with an obvious secular outlook. The other paper leaned right with a more spiritual Weltanschauung. The television stations were only mildly biased, if at all. The political bias of both papers proved mostly mild, too (although the morning paper hardly ever disclosed any of President Kennedy's philandering). I doubt many who watched or subscribed were unaware of the obliqueness of the outlets.

HELP SAVE A CONSERVATIVE MEDIA OUTLET

For those of you who are AT&T and Direct TV subscribers, this decision by AT&T to not renew their contract with One America News will affect you. This is censorship and we have to fight against it. Put in a formal complaint against their decision to not renew OAN's contract which expires in April. If you would also like to voice your objection to AT&T's decision, their phone number where you can speak to a representative is 800 288 2020.

DirecTV plans to drop conservative One America News Network from its lineup, Bloomberg reported.

At the time of this reporting, no other major U.S. cable providers carry OAN.

What are the details?

The nationwide satellite television broadcaster recently notified Herring Networks, OAN's owner, that it would no longer carry the company's channels.

In a statement obtained by Bloomberg, the company said, "We informed Herring Networks that, following a routine internal review, we do not plan to enter into a new contract when our current agreement expires."

The contract with Herring Networks is set to expire in April. At the time of this reporting, Herring Networks has yet to issue a public statement on the matter.
